Hello!

You might have heard of sermon notes before. This is similar, but a little bit different!

A sermon dialogue is a conversation! When we talk about what we have learned, and then write it down, it helps us remember things better. According to Edgar Dale, we only remember 20% of what we hear and we remember 70% of what we say and write!

This booklet is a way to help you talk with an important adult in your life, a parent, a grandparent, an aunt or uncle, or even your small group leader at church about the sermon you heard.

As part of confirmation, each person is asked to complete 12 sermon dialogues for the year (or about 1 per month). Simply keep this booklet inside of your Bible and bring it with you to church on Sundays.

If you attend a different church one week, you can fill out the dialogue for that sermon. Please do not use Wednesday Lenten services or Wednesday nights at Calvary to complete your dialogues.
